

3D Fairy

Materials

30cm White cotton fabric
30cm Organza sheer white fabric
Embroidery threads
Floriani Wet N Gone
Floriani Heat N Stay



Step 1

Iron on the Heat N stay medium tearaway to the wrong side of your white cotton fabric, hoop your fabric, I used Sue Box's Enchanted Fairy for my design. Sew the design out on your embroidery machine. Put this aside you are now ready to make your 3D wings and additional flowers



Step 2

Hoop 1 layer of your sheer organza fabric with 1 layer of Wet N Gone, place your hoop in your embroidery machine



Step 3

You can either use your embroidery software to delete all colours other than the wings and flowers or just using your embroidery machine skip thread colours until you reach just the wing colours or flower colours— simply sew out an extra set of wings and flowers on your organza (I made my wings and flowers 10 percent large as this adds more dimension to your embroidery)

Step 4

Once you have finished your embroidery remove the organza from the hoop and simply rinse the Wet N Gone – Don't wash all the stabilizer away, let them dry and they will be quite stiff

Step 5

You are now ready to either trim around the embroidery with a small pair of embroidery scissors or you can use a stencil burner to run around the outer edge



Step 6

Using monofilament thread in your sewing machine, sew the wings into position and/or your additional flowers – spray the wings and flowers with a little water and mould into desired shape and position (this is why we don't completely wash the Wet N Gone away) – you have now finished – you are now ready to frame it.
