

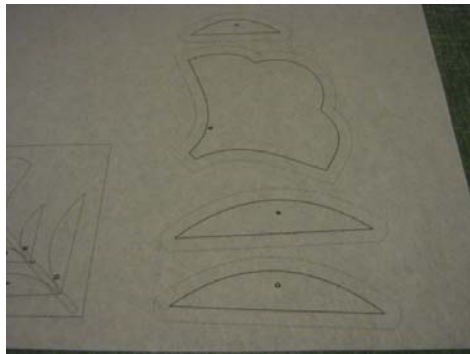
Turned Edge Applique

Stitch n Wash

Requirements:

- Floranini Stitch N Wash Fusible
- 1 x Glue Stick
- Desired Design
- Small pair of scissors

1. Trace your design onto the Stitch N Wash Fusible using a pencil or if using a computer with an inkjet or bubble printer, print directly onto the stabiliser.
Note: Do not use fusible stabilizer in a laser printer use the non fusible Stitch n Wash and adhere to the fabric with a glue stick.



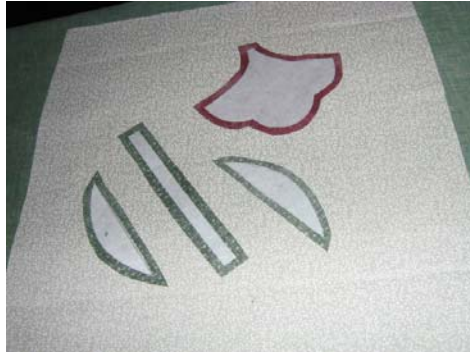
2. Cut your shapes out of the Stitch N Wash Fusible, a small pair of fine scissors (manicure) gives a nice sharp finish. Make sure you now place the fusible side to the wrong side of your fabric see photo, now iron in position using a medium heat seating on your iron.



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3. Using a small pair of scissors cut your pieces out of your fabric with a 1/8 – 3/16 inch seam allowance.



4. Now using your glue stick run around the outer edge of you appliqué clip inside curves to within 2 – 3 threads of the stabilizer and turn your seam allowance towards the wrong side of the fabric. Leave the seam allowance unturned for shapes that fit under other shapes. You should now have a nice sharp edge to your appliqué.



5. Apply a small dab of glue stick to the back of the appliqué piece and place in desire position.



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6. You are now ready to either sew around your appliqué by hand or by machine.



7. Always wash your stabilizer away before quilting.
